



Parking Your Car

Sacramento is a very walkable city, but with so much to see and do throughout the region, it helps to have an insider's peek into the best ways to get around.

We know a lot of our visitors drive into Sacramento, and if your hotel doesn't have a parking garage, or you just need to park for dinner or a visit to a museum, there's an easier way than just driving around looking for spots. City

parking spots in certain areas can be reserved via the **ParkMobile** app, letting you better plan what time you leave and be confident that you'll have parking close to your destination.

The ParkMobile app also allows drivers to pay for parking, and if the meter is about to run out, drivers receive an alert on their phones letting them know, with the option to add more money to keep from getting a ticket.

In many places in Sacramento, drivers will see a circular sign with a number and a plus sign in it, such as (2+). That sign means that the rate for parking will go up after the first two hours, and the meters themselves

have the information of exact costs.

Public Transit

For those who prefer to leave the car

at home and travel around the region and downtown area, the **Sacramento Regional Transit** operates an array of buses and light rail lines that quickly and efficiently serve most areas visitors wish to go in Califor-

A mobile-optimized website at m.sacrt.com allows riders to plan trips and check real-time bus and

nia's capital.

train locations as well as the next scheduled stops at each station. The mobile site also makes it easy to find information on any delays via its service alerts tab.

When it comes to purchasing and managing tickets, the easiest way is to use the ZipPass mobile app from Sacramento Regional Transit. Tickets can also be purchased at kiosks, but let's face it—you're probably more likely to forget where you put a paper ticket than your smartphone.

Share the Mode

Look for the cherry red Jump bikes and scooters within city limits of



Sacramento and West Sacramento. Make sure you've got the app loaded and grab a ride to take you as far as you need to go. Just make sure and park it properly once you've arrived.



Bike Share—Try a candy-red Jump electric-assist bike at a cost of \$1 for 15 minutes. They're stationed at curbside hubs around Sacramento, West Sac and Davis. Download the app and start riding!

Rent Your Wheels—Trek Bicycle in Midtown (2419 K St.) rents bikes—a good option if red's not your color or you need a ride for youngsters. (916) 447-2453

Coolest Bike Racks in Town—

Look for local sculptor Gina Rossi's artsy racks around town, including a martini glass by Paragary's (27th and N streets), Day of the Dead by Zocalo (18th and Capitol), a fish in front of Lou's Sushi (28th and P) and a beer bottle opener by New Helvetia Brewing Company (18th and Broadway). Party Parade—Decorate your ride (think colored lights, streamers), don a crazy hat and join up with Midtown's Bike Party, held the first Friday of the month, in a pedal-powered procession that goes for 10 or 15 miles, usually includes a stop or two, and abides by this mantra: stop at red lights, stay to the right, pack your trash, don't get smashed, ride straight, don't hate. American River Bike Trail-

The crown jewel of the Sacramento region, the Jedediah Smith Memorial Trail runs for 32 miles, much of it alongside the American River, from Sacramento's Discovery Park to Folsom. It's a gorgeous ride, and accessible from most parks in the American River Parkway.



NOT EXACTLY A WORKOUT

Hop on the Sac Brew Bike, a 15-seat rolling, peddling party. Start at the brew bike's bar (1519 19th St., with local beer and cider on tap), and expect to visit a variety of downtown and midtown watering holes. **sacbrewbike.com**

SOLOMON'S DELICATESSEN

Sacramento's lively K Street recently welcomed its newest tenant, Solomon's Delicatessen. Large glass panels below a colorful restored mural house the former Tower Records location-turned-deli and bar. Upstairs lies the Russ Room—which pays homage to the late Russ Solomon, founder of Tower Records—a '70s chic music venue and art gallery (you'll see some rare images of Jimi Hendrix, The Beatles, The Who, Jim Morrison and other legends) sporting a striped colored felt roof and reflective glass chandeliers. Pick up a pickle 'tini from the bar and catch sets from local artists like Destroy Boys, a punk band that got its start in Sac. The crew at Solomon's aims to keep more than just the deli fresh, planning to swap the art gallery out for a new theme every couple months. 730 K St., (916) 857-8200,

ACE OF SPADES

A staple of Sacramento, Ace of Spades is an all-ages (some exceptions depending on the show) music venue. Generally a packed house of 1,000 showgoers, Ace of Spades offers beer and spirits from four in-house bars, as well as food from the adjacent Cafe Bernardo until 9 p.m. (Tip: Get in line early if you want a seat in the dining area; it fills up quickly!) Catch a variety of acts

at Ace of Spades, from national superstars like Snoop Dogg and Mac Demarco to local legend Hobo Johnson. 1417 R St., (916) 930-0220,

HOLY DIVER

From the team that brought Sacramento Ace of Spades comes Holy Diver, an all-ages (some exceptions depending on the show) music venue tattooed with skull art on the outside and rock and metal paraphernalia on the inside. Grab a slice from Pizza Cult and play pinball on the shredder-inspired machines (Iron Maiden, Metallica and AC/DC) before catching a show in the intimate but energetic hall. Rock and metal star at this venue, but Holy Diver hosts a variety of shows. (Tip: Be on the lookout for the Local \$5 Showcases, which host local artists for a fun, affordable night.) 1517 21st St., holydiversac.com

SHADY LADY SALOON

Shady Lady Saloon, located in the Historic R Street District, takes guests into the gothic speakeasy upon entry with its red velour furniture, candelabra- and mirror-laden walls and dimly lit aesthetic. All ages are welcome during the day for food and drink, but when the night's musical act takes the black curtained stage at 9 p.m., the shows are 21 and up. Sip on a classic cocktail like the Corpse Reviver #2 and take in tunes from


HARLOW'S RESTAURANT AND NIGHTCLUB


TORCH CLUB



Sacramento residents have been making craft beer since the Gold Rush, but the brew scene has never been more vibrant and exciting than it is now. Home to more than 70 breweries and countless more brewpubs, the city is a hops-filled paradise—if you know where to look. Here are a few places to start.

URBAN ROOTS BREWERY & SMOKEHOUSE

For killer barbecue and a neighborhood block party vibe to go with your beer, there is Urban Roots, a spacious downtown brewery that combines the communal spirit of German bierhalls with the tastes and smells of a Texas-style smokehouse. While saisons are the specialty, the tap list ranges from crowd-pleasing west coast IPAs to experimental small-batch brews and special guest draughts, all designed to complement the brisket, pulled pork, ribs, collard greens and other Southern favorites on the menu. Owners Peter Hoey and Rob Archie hoped to create a community-oriented space where strangers become friends over a pint and a platter, so this family-friendly brewery regularly plays host to movie nights and encourages hobnobbing with patio picnic table seating. Check out the playful mural by local artist Maren Conrad or the brightly colored tiled walls inside, which keep the highly photogenic space from veering into burly rusticity. 1322 V St., urbanrootsbrewing.com

NEW HELVETIA BREWING COMPANY

The most unabashedly Sacramento brewery in the region has to be New Helvetia, which showcases Sacramento history alongside its strong lineup of hazy IPAs. Tucked between a cluster of restaurants on the edge of Land Park, the unpretentious space is decorated with memorabilia from Buffalo Brewing Company, the Sacramento brewery that became the largest brewery west of the Mississippi upon its opening in 1890. Many of New Helvetia's beers are named after Sacramento landmarks and cultural touchstones, like the Delta Breeze wheat ale and the Midtown Janky saison. They regularly release beers in collaboration with their local competitors along with one-off brews with other Sacramento stars, including a coffee stout with Temple Coffee Roasters and a chocolate porter with chocolatier Ginger Elizabeth Hahn. Since there's no food menu, guests are encouraged to bring in dinner or grab something from one of the food trucks often parked outside.

AT EASE BREWING

New to the Sacramento beer scene, this little brewery has already garnered a following amongst a very specific demographic: local veterans. Owner and brewmaster Col. Mike Conrad served in the army for 27 years before retiring to civilian life. Hints at Conrad's military background are peppered throughout the dark and snug Midtown storefront: ammo crate lids become tasting trays, for instance, and the tap handles are decorated with uniform ribbons. But Conrad and his family, who can be found pouring at the bar, wanted to avoid anything gimmicky and garish, so don't expect camo, weapons, or rah-rah Americana. The focus remains on the beer. After home brewing for 20 years, Conrad has designed a tap list that satisfies the hopheads but doesn't shy away from more adventurous pickings like the Black Hawk, a black saison, or the Top of the Line, a lemon coriander wheat ale.

THE SHACK

Though it opened as a roadside root beer stop in 1931, The Shack has found new life in its current incarnation as a beloved hangout spot for beer lovers. This pup-friendly hangout is a Sacramento institution, equally appreciated for its chill atmosphere as it is for its large selection of Belgian beers. With funky decor, live music on the weekends, and a menu of gut-busting burgers and sandwiches, The Shack would be perfectly at home on the edge of a beach boardwalk somewhere, luring in sun-drenched revelers for a cold St. Feuillien saison and a round of fries. When you're tired of beer pretension and flash-in-the-pan trends, The Shack welcomes you with open arms and a dizzying array of lambics and Flemish ales. Given its accessible menu and laid-back character, The Shack is also a good spot to bring the kids.

ALARO CRAFT BREWERY

If the thought of another brewpub menu weighted down with burgers and pretzels makes you ready to give up drinking entirely, Alaro is there to get you back in the game. Owners Annette and Ray Ballestero teamed up with head brewer Chris Keeton to develop a roster of elegant and high-quality handcrafted beers that are just as elevated and timeless as the Iberian-style tapas they are meant to pair with. Their flagship Castillo IPA recently won a gold at the Great American Beer Festival, and is a refreshing partner to their flagship dish, the seafood paella. Other menu highlights include the pulpo gallegos, gambes al ajillo, elotes, and pan con tomate. Equal parts brewery and restaurant, this full-service Midtown gastropub is a destination for beer lovers and teetotalers alike.

CAPITAL HOP SHOP

Located in a refurbished auto garage in the heart of downtown, Capital Hop Shop delivers one of the most curated craft beer selections in the city. With more than 30 beers on constant rotation, Hop Shop manages to cover just about every major beer trend at any given time-did someone say milkshake IPAs?—while also offering a range of experimental, seasonal and imported craft brews, as well as whatever the owners and staff are into on any given day. With such a heavy emphasis on craft and a propensity for featuring rare releases, Hop Shop has secured itself a devoted following of serious beer enthusiasts. But with its friendly staff and satisfying menu of the buffalo wings and mac and cheese variety, this brewpub attracts state workers, neighborhood residents, and hungry passersby with equal ease.



Pak

Shopping obsessives will love Sacramento's historic Oak Park neighborhood. It offers a slew of boutiques, all clustered in and near the Broadway Triangle, architect Ron Vrilakas' stylish mixed-used development. Here's a look at some of our favorite places.—*Marybeth Bizjak*

DISPLAY: California

This shop sells artisan goods made in California, with a heavy emphasis on Sacramento makers such as Jake Castro (leather goods), Ana Apple (children's apparel) and Cabine (jewelry). There's a nice selection of women's apparel and accessories from women designers and women-owned businesses, along with locally made art, prints and food products such as natural soda syrups from Burly Beverages and condiments from Nasty Sauce. Rire

Josie Lee was a college student when she opened her first women's boutique in 2013. This is her second Rire location, offering fun, flirty fashions at affordable prices. (Nothing costs more than \$60.) The store works with small-scale designers producing fast fashion, and the inventory changes constantly. Products range from message T-shirts and boho-chic dresses to faux fur-lined anoraks, along with journals, tote bags, handmade cards and jewelry. 3330 Broadway; rireboutique.com

Nectar

Owner/artist Janell Lacayo makes original, one-off earrings, necklaces and bracelets at a tiny workbench behind the cash register. She also loves natural stones, a passion she acquired as a child on rock digs with her gemologist grandparents. Underground Books

This friendly African-American bookstore, operated by former mayor Kevin Johnson's mother (known to all as "Mother Rose"), serves as Oak Park's literary hub. Located in what was once a tire store, this urban nursery carries a wide variety of heirloom plants, organic local veggies and herbs, and hard-to-find perennials from Annie's Annuals. The garden shop stocks ergonomic garden tools, hanging terrariums, gardening books, artisanal pottery, greeting cards and garden decor. Strapping

This whimsical little store is crammed with cards, gifts, toys, housewares and novelties such as naughty lollypops. (Consider it Spencer's for the hipster set.) Strapping is not a "bougie boutique," says Stewart, describing the store as fun, accessible, affordable and inclusive. 




