Historic Downtown Calgary Walking Tour

FROM CALGARY • TWO HOURS

Every building tells a story. Calgary's downtown spins a yarn of a brash frontier town that has grown into a lively urban center. Walk outside as weather permits – or inside using the +15 Skywalk network, as you straddle with one foot in the past and one in the present, following a "ribbon of steel" through the heart of the city. As your tour guide navigates around such areas as Stephen Avenue Mall, the Bow River Pathway, and other downtown areas, you'll also learn where Calgarians go for fine food and dining and discover where some favourite spots to shop in downtown are located.



Calgary Tower Admission

The YUKON MP snowshoes make snowshoeing through the deepest snow a breeze. 60-minute snowshoe tours through the River Valley are available from October through to March.

FROM BANFF • SEVEN HOURS THIRTY MINUTES

Learn about the culture, geology and wildlife while exploring the spectacular sights of the renowned mountain town of Banff. This sightseeing tour will take you to some of the most incredible sights and sounds that western Canada has to offer. Head up the Banff Gondola to the peak of Sulphur Mountain for a 360 degree panorama of the Bow Valley. Complete the day with a historical tour of Lake Minnewanka on a Lake Minnewanka Cruise. Highlights include: Bow Falls, Tunnel Mountain Drive, Hoodoos, Surprise Corner, Lake Minnewanka Loop, Two Jack Viewpoint, Banff Gondola, Lake Minnewanka Cruise and Sulphur Mountain.



Lake Minnewanka Cruise

This interpretive boat tour of magnificent Lake Minnewanka will immerse you in a rugged wilderness steeped in history, Aboriginal folklore and geology. Nestled in the heart of Banff National Park, Lake Minnewanka offers some of the most interesting and spectacular scenery found anywhere in the Canadian Rockies. For more than 10,000 years people have hunted and camped along these shores and now you too can discover its wild nature and hidden wonders. This tour does not include transfers, you will need to make your own way to the dock which is 15 minutes from Banff.



Banff Gondola

FROM BANFF • ONE HOUR

Discover sweeping scenes of six mountain ranges, the Bow Valley and the charming town of Banff from the Sulphur Mountain summit. Take a breathtaking ascent to the pinnacle of Sulphur Mountain for an awe inspiring 360-degree panorama of sheer mountain majesty. Once you're at the top, begin your adventure by strolling the boardwalk to the Cosmic Ray Station and Sanson's Peak and learn about Canada's first national park. Then, head inside to explore the mountaintop discovery centre. Fuel up on grab-and-go fare at Castle Mountain Coffee or enjoy an elegant meal at the award-winning Sky Bistro. Transfers to the gondola are not included.

River Explorer Canoe Tour

FROM BANFF • ONE HOUR THIRTY MINUTES

Experience the thrill of paddling in a Voyageur canoe. Relive the late 1800's when these boats were used to transport pelts during the fur trade era. This Canoe Tour on the Bow River in Banff is a fun and interactive way to explore the waterways of Banff National Park. Perfect for families. No paddling experience necessary. Transportation to the dock is not included.



Wildlife on the Bow River, Canoe Tour

FROM BANFF • ONE HOUR THIRTY MINUTES

Paddle along the Bow River in a 12-seater canoe as the sun sets in Banff's backyard during this guided canoe tour. Dip your oars into the water as a team and take in the wildlife and mountain scenery as your guide tells you about the animals and land. Be on the lookout for elk, bald eagles, beaver, and muskrats as the current carries you along. Transportation to the dock is not included.



FROM BANFF • FIVE HOURS

Horseshoe Canyon River Rafting is a half-day whitewater tour that offers adventure lovers rafting thrills and excitement close to Banff and Canmore. The Horseshoe Canyon section offers spectacular scenery, big waves and up to Grade IV whitewater. Experience a sense of remoteness while you raft your way through shale canyons and awesome whitewater. Chinook Rafting is a half day tour which winds through the picturesque landscape of Kananaskis Country. The Kananaskis River is a great whitewater experience for families as this trip includes a scenic float to the finish where you can swim and splash in the water. Transportation to the site is not included.





Discover Banff & it's Wildlife

FROM BANFF • THREE HOURS

This tour takes you to Banff's landmarks and historic places. Hear how the 11,000 year old human history of the Bow Valley changed when three railway workers rediscovered the Cave & Basin, now a National Historic Site where your time will be spent enjoying the sights, taking photos and participating in short walks to view points. There are many stops on this tour, highlights include Bow Falls, Banff Springs Hotel, Surprise Corner, Hoodoos, Bow Valley Viewpoint and Lake Minnewanka.

Evening Wildlife Safari

FROM BANFF • TWO HOURS

This sightseeing and wildlife seeking tour travels through a variety of landscapes giving you the best chance to observe animals in their natural environment. Learn what is threatening wildlife today and how the National Parks strive to protect animals and their habitat. Discover Lake Louise & Moraine Lake

FROM BANFF • FOUR HOURS

On this afternoon sightseeing tour you will visit the "Jewel of the Canadian Rockies," Lake Louise and the world renowned Moraine Lake – both are part of a UNESCO World Heritage Site and you will have time to take photos and explore their shorelines. Learn about the areas mountaineering history and how a tragic accident at Lake Louise shaped Canadian mountain culture. Finally, walk to a viewpoint in the Valley of Ten Peaks overlooking Moraine Lake. Highlights of this tour include Bow Valley Parkway, Castle Mountain, Lake Louise and Moraine Lake.



Discover Lake Louise & Moraine Lake with Dinner

FROM BANFF • SIX HOURS

The pale turquoise hue of Lake Louise comes from sunlight reflecting off mountain-dust particles suspended in the glacial melt-water. It's a natural wonder that you just can't stop staring at. You'll take your time meandering through the scenic Bow Valley Parkway with your eyes peeled for wildlife, and savour an early dinner in the warm log cabin ambiance of Baker Creek Mountain Resort. Then you'll head to Moraine Lake where you can choose to take a short walk up the "rockpile" pathway for the famous lake view from a scenic viewpoint, before you head back to Banff as the setting sun bathes the mountains in a golden glow.



Banff Horseback Riding

FROM BANFF • MULTIPLE DURATIONS

Enjoy a truly western heritage experience in Banff National Park, by taking a trail ride which follows one of the historic routes made in the 1920s by the original Canadian Rockies explorers. With over 300 horses, Banff Trail Riders are able to match the perfect horse to each rider, ensuring a safe and memorable experience. Ranging from one to four hours, there's a myriad of trail options available.

Banff Signature Hikes

FROM BANFF • SEVEN HOURS

Join a hiking guide on a full day tour that includes four to six hours of hiking time. Share the passion for the mountains with a local guide on a choice of classic hikes of the Banff and Lake Louise area. The hikes available include Stanley Glacier, Larch Valley, Kootenay National Park Trails and Plain of 6 Glaciers. The tour includes a Certified Hiking Guide, Banff hotel pick up and drop off, use of hiking poles and binoculars and a packed picnic lunch.





Via Ferrata: Explorer Route Climbing Tour

FROM BANFF • TWO HOURS THIRTY MINUTES

This is an introduction into climbing a Via Ferrata in the Rockies. After explaining the equipment, your certified guide takes you climbing along fixed anchors, cables and ladders before you cross a suspension bridge. A free shuttle from Banff Townsite (Banff Norquay Bus) takes you to your adventure. Your tour includes a certified guide, equipment orientation, safety equipment and helmet and chairlift admission. More advanced options are also available for those with climbing experience.

Eat the Castle at Fairmont Banff Springs

FROM BANFF • TWO HOURS THIRTY MINUTES

Enjoy food and beverage pairings at a relaxed pace with a storytelling local guide, who'll share the stories behind this iconic setting. Your tour guide will greet you at the Fairmont Banff Springs Hotel and have a reserved table either inside or out on the terrace. The tour starts with refreshments while also taking a sneak peak into how the hotel sources some "mile zero" ingredients year round - despite living in a winter zone six months a year. The tour progresses into fine French Brasserie fare at the Vermillion Room. You'll visit Grapes Wine Bar and 1888 Chophouse before they open to the public and be treated to exquisite house-made ingredients.

Takakkaw Falls, in the magnificent Yoho Valley, will be the final stop before heading back to Lake Louise.





Yamnuska Wolfdog Sanctuary

FROM CANMORE • ONE HOUR

During your visit to the Wolfdog Sanctuary you will gain a better understanding about wild wolves and their importance in the natural environment, while also seeing first hand wolf behaviour through the wolfdogs at the sanctuary. You will have plenty of photo opportunities and ample time to speak with the sanctuary guardian who will answer all your questions. This exclusive tour has limited availability and a maximum of ten participants per tour to ensure the wolfdogs stay inquisitive and close during your visit. Transportation to the sanctuary is not included.



Adventure Cave Tour

FROM CANMORE • SIX HOURS

This adventure tour has been recognized as a Canadian Signature Experience. Cavers will rappel 18m (that's six stories!) inside the cave, plus have the opportunity to push their limits in the warm-up squeeze, challenge squeeze, and the Laundry Chute – a section of the cave that adds a little extra challenge but a whole lot of extra fun. Visit the impressive Grand Gallery – the largest known room in the cave, then surround yourself with ancient cave formations in the Grotto. You will spend approximately four hours underground on this tour.



Scenic Helicopter Tours

FROM CANMORE • MULTIPLE DURATIONS

Some of the most dramatic views of Western Canada can only be experienced from the sky. Alpine Helicopters have been operating scenic flights for over 50 years. They offer three tours: Three Sisters Peaks Tour is 25 minutes, Mt. Assiniboine Tour is 35 minutes and Continental Divide Tour is 45 minutes. The shortest tour takes you between the Three Sisters peaks and into the Spray Valley. En route you will see the magnificent Goat Range where you will observe radiant aqua-turquoise colours of the Spray lakes and rugged peaks of the Rockies. The 35 minute tour adds a close up of Mt. Assiniboine and Gloria Glaciers and the longest takes you deeper into the Continental Divide. There are also 55 minute private tours available.



Cowboys & Coal Mines, Historial Walk

FROM CANMORE • ONE HOUR THIRTY MINUTES

Enjoy an immersive walking tour of Canmore – a truly authentic local experience. Rated as a leisurely walk, this historical walk brings the sights and sounds of the wild west to life and is suitable for the whole family. Activity level for this tour is rated easy with mostly flat elevation. A three hour Wilderness and Wildlife Walk is also available, which requires a slightly higher level of fitness due to rolling hills elevation.



Mountain Lakes & Waterfalls

FROM CANMORE • TWELVE HOURS

Visit the most treasured spots in the Canadian Rockies on this remarkable excursion through Banff and Yoho National Parks. Experience the evolution of land and discover how it has shaped the appearance of the spectacular natural wonders found in these mountain settings. Travel along the Bow Valley Parkway and Johnston Canyon. A BBQ lunch will be provided with time to relax at Emerald Lake Lodge. Next it is on to Moraine Lake in the Valley of the Ten Peaks before crossing the Great Divide into Yoho National Park via the scenic Kicking Horse Pass. The magnificent Yoho Valley and Takakkaw Falls will be the final scenic stop before heading back to Canmore.

Trickster Tour is 30 minutes and you'll fly to the most iconic trio of peaks in Canmore, known as The Three Sisters. Explore the Spray Valley and learn the indigenous story of how I-ktomni would try to "trick" the Three Sisters into marriage. Sleeping Warrior Tour is 40 minutes. This popular adventure has all the fantastic scenery you expect of the Rocky Mountains. You are transported to Haig Glacier and beyond. Fly over "where the warrior slept" to see the marvellous glaciers and lakes of Banff National Park.



Discover Jasper & it's Wildlife

FROM JASPER • THREE HOURS

Jasper National Park is well known for its significance as a World Heritage site due to its natural beauty and historical significance. Local guides show you some of Jasper's hidden gems and share their knowledge of the history, geology and ecology of the area. You will be amazed at some of the beautiful scenery, whilst also learning about the ways the wildlife in the area contribute to the rich diversity of the National Park. Knowledgeable guides are trained to seek out all of the park's most iconic creatures. Big or small, Jasper National Park provides a great opportunity to view animals in their natural habitat.



Sunrise Sightseeing & Wildlife

FROM JASPER • THREE HOURS

The early morning light is spectacular as it illuminates the mirror lakes and snow-capped peaks of Jasper. The reward for an early morning departure is a combination of ideal photography conditions and some of the best opportunities to view wildlife before Jasper starts to bustle. Enjoy coffee and a light breakfast as you search for bears, moose, elk, deer and wolves. Your guides know the best places to provide you with the best shots!.



Maligne Valley & Guided Walk

FROM JASPER • FIVE HOURS

This tour is a guided interpretive drive up the Maligne Valley. The exploration will include a stop at Maligne Canyon for a gentle guided walk to the first two bridges above the gorge, a short stop at the "disappearing" Medicine Lake, and finally Maligne Lake. At this picturesque gem of the Canadian Rockies you can choose to participate on a Maligne Lake boat cruise to world famous Spirit Island or enjoy a guided hike along the Mary Schaffer Loop. This tour is mainly a nature, scenic, and geological voyage but it is also an excellent opportunity to see some of Jasper's wildlife.



Jasper Motorcycle Sidecar Tours

FROM JASPER • MULTIPLE DURATIONS

Jasper Motorcycles offers chauffeured sidecar tours for two passengers on Harley Davidson motorcycles, one passenger in the sidecar and one behind the driver. At the beginning of the tours, recommendations are made for the best destination for the duration of the tour. Being flexible can lead to the most favourable wildlife viewing, or simply experiencing something more unique in Jasper National Park. The one hour tour includes Patricia and Pyramid Lakes, Maligne Canyon or Marmot Mountain. The two hour tour includes Maligne Canyon, Medicine Lake, Athabasca Falls, Marmot Mountain, Sunwapta and Athabasca Falls or Mount Edith Cavell.



Explore Jasper with Maligne Lake Cruise

FROM JASPER • SIX HOURS FIFTEEN MINUTES

Explore the spectacular natural treasures of the largest national park in the Canadian Rockies. Stand above the massive walls of Maligne Canyon for stunning views of rushing waterfalls, discover the mystery of the disappearing water at Medicine Lake and experience the scenic Maligne Lake Cruise – all on this sightseeing tour. Highlights include Jasper town, Pyramid Lake, Patricia Lake, Maligne Canyon, Medicine Lake and Maligne Lake.



Maligne Lake Cruise

FROM JASPER • ONE HOUR THIRTY MINUTES

The 90 minute interpretive cruise travels 14 km down the lake through Sampson Narrows and onto Spirit Island. The vessels are staffed by recognized Heritage Tourism Guides and Coast Guard licensed pilots. Learn of the local history, geology, wildlife and glaciology of Maligne Lake and of Jasper National Park as some of the most spectacular scenery in the Rockies drift past your window. At Spirit Island the boat lands to allow for a short walk to the viewpoint overlooking the mountain ringed southern shores of Maligne Lake. Transportation to the dock is not included.



Jasper Float Trip

FROM JASPER • TWO HOURS THIRTY MINUTES

Enjoy a gentle rafting tour on the Athabasca River for a unique perspective of Jasper National Park. The 16 kilometre round trip passes through many small sets of rapids and calm stretches, which allows your National Park Licensed Guide to point out the natural and human history of Jasper. Specially designed rafts offer a safe, comfortable ride that any first time rafter will enjoy. This trip is for everyone from toddlers to seniors. Transportation to the launch area is not included.

Pyramid Lake Canoe Adventures

FROM JASPER • THREE HOURS

Only minutes from town, Pyramid Lake offers unique opportunities to appreciate the natural beauty that surrounds Jasper. Wild Current specialise in unique canoe adventures, viewing numerous snow-capped peaks and providing an opportunity to see wildlife that call the area home such as osprey, loons, muskrat and beaver. The "Sunburst" Canoe Adventure is the perfect way to start your day in the Rockies, whilst the Pyramid Lake 'Evening' Canoe Adventure provides an incredible evening experience in a pristine Rocky Mountain environment. Transportation to the launch site is not included.





Rock Climbing Tours

FROM JASPER • FOUR HOURS

A real adventure, in the experienced hands of Rockaboo Mountain Adventures. Choose from two tour options. Experience Athabasca Glacier is a half-day tour venturing down the Icefields Parkway to the famous Columbia Ice Fields. You will gear up to step onto the breathtaking Athabasca Glacier. Walk through snow and ice while your experienced guide navigates crevasses so that you may explore the glacier and ice caves safely. The Experience Rock Climbing half day adventure is a hands-on experience and is fun for the whole family. Your guide coaches you as you rappel, or are lowered, to the bottom of a perfect limestone wall next to the Athabasca River. Next, you climb!



Jasper Downtown Food Tours

FROM JASPER • THREE HOURS

This Downtown foodie tour will take you to four local joints, visiting points of interest and taking in some of Jasper's tastiest tales along the way. At each restaurant, guests will try a top dish and a perfectly paired boozy drink to experience the real taste of Jasper's food scene. What's on the menu? Not telling. It's all part of the adventure! This tour includes a leisurely 1.5km walk.



Bites on E-Bikes Tour

FROM JASPER • FIVE HOURS

Discover some of Jasper's finest restaurants while navigating the scenic back roads of Jasper National Park on an effortless E-Bike. Bites on E-Bikes is a 25km tour of the scenic back roads of Jasper National Park while visiting some of the most delectable restaurants tucked away among the wilderness. Along the way you will be catching glimpses of local wildlife, stopping at spectacular viewpoints, visiting canyons, rivers, beaches and lakes. At each of the restaurants you will be served delectable local masterpieces to help you re-fuel.



Lunch & Dinner Peak Nic

FROM JASPER • THREE HOURS

Cooking in the back-country is an art. It takes careful planning, cool outdoor gear and lightweight ingredients. At Peak Nic, you will experience how it feels to be completely self-sufficient in the great outdoors. Equipped with a small backpack full of ingredients, outdoor cooking gear and a hiking pole, you will be hiking a 3.8km intermediate trail to a famous local peak - Old Fort Point. Once at the top, you'll set up camp and learn how to cook delicious food in the outdoors, with a "leave-notrace" approach. All thats left is for you to enjoy your meal while taking in panoramic views. There are two tour options, one enjoying lunch and the other for dinner.



Columbia Icefield Heli Tours

FROM ICEFIELDS PARKWAY • MULTIPLE DURATIONS

Rockies Heli Canada will take you on a voyage of awe and discovery whichever of their three tours you choose. 6 Glaciers Heli Tour is twenty minutes. You'll soar through the clouds, before flying by the Cline Pass, Lion and Lioness glaciers and view a spectacular 900 foot waterfall flowing from two aqua green lakes. The 6 Glaciers Heli Tour with Wilderness Walk & Picnic Lunch is one hour twenty minutes, and adds a wilderness walk along an alpine lake and a light meal. The Complete Columbia Icefield Heli Tour is fifty five minutes and visits North Americas hydrological apex and the Continental Divide, plus three major Icefields. Transportation to the take off site is not included.



Columbia Icefield Skywalk

FROM ICEFIELDS PARKWAY • TWO HOURS

The experience begins with a five minute scenic transfer by coach from the Columbia Icefield Glacier Discovery Centre. Take your time to journey along the Discovery Trail; a fully-accessible, cliff-edge walkway that extends along the Sunwapta Valley, from where you'll see hints from life thousands of years ago along with mountain and glacial vistas. Finally, you step onto the glass-floored observation platform for a unique perspective of the Sunwapta Valley which sits 280 meters below. Transportation is not included.



Columbia Icefield Adventure

FROM ICEFIELDS PARKWAY • ONE HOUR THIRTY MINUTES

The Columbia Icefield is located in Jasper National Park. The Icefield – the largest sub-polar body of ice in North America – is one of the reasons why the United Nations declared Canada's four Rocky Mountain Parks as World Heritage Sites. The Icefield covers 325 square kilometres with solid ice up to 350 metres (1150 feet) deep. On this tour, you will take in the icy slopes of the Athabasca Glacier on an Ice Explorer! This tour departs from Icefield Parkway Discovery Centre.

Columbia Icefield Combo

FROM ICEFIELDS PARKWAY • FOUR HOURS

This option combines the Columbia Icefield Adventure and the Columbia Icefield Skywalk into one package. A once-in-a-lifetime experience at the Columbia Icefield. Climb on board an all-terrain Ice Explorer and head on to the surface of the Athabasca Glacier. Walk on the ancient ice while you learn about glaciers and icefields. Stroll along a cliff-edged walkway that leads to the jawdropping glass floored Columbia Icefield Skywalk, separating you from the floor of the valley by a 918-foot drop. Transportation to Icefield Parkway Discovery Centre is not included.
